As we announced in our last newsletter – Namibia is open for tourism since 01. September. Meanwhile it has become even easier to travel to Namibia – and as Namibia is one of the few countries worldwide, that has been removed from the COVID risk countries – it is even easier to travel back home. We are seeing a good increase of travellers and also hope for an extension of the hunting season into december.

We are very grateful to have hosted international clients on all our areas



in Namibia during the past two months. Clients came in from Sweden and Germany. Hunts were extremely successful and some exceptional trophies have been harvested. Max from Germany was able to get the new NAPHA No.1 Sable hunted with a bow measuring 45 6/8“.

Furthermore he was able to harvest a huge 165 pound leopard early morning of his secondlast day. Generally we find that the trophy quality has even improved more after this forced hunting pause.





Also our clients from Sweden were rewarded with some great trophies.

Next to some good Impala, Gemsbuck(Oryx), Warthog, Springbuck, Blue Wildebeest and Kudu they got a record book Eland, Black Wildebeest and Waterbuck. All hunts were long stalks, with a lot of crawling and sweating, just the way these two young guys liked it.



Titus from Germany responded to our past Covid specials to hunt for his lifelong dream – a big male leopard! The hunt was very well prepared by Werner and on his arrival there were two old males on the baits. Late afternoon while they were sitting at the blind a herd of Black Faced Impala which was at the



nearby water suddenly started to jump into all directions. Full of confidence a 158 pound leopard stepped into the open. With tail held high and full of confidence, he walked towards the water. A good shot ended this epic hunting experience – a dream come true. Furthermore Titus was able to



harvest some of the specialties of the Little Waterberg, like Damara Dik Dik, Black Faced Impala and Brown Hyena. All trophies were rewarded with a Napha gold medal.

We know that the Covid situation in Europe and the States is now at it's worst with the winter coming. But we still want to encourage you to consider travelling to Namibia and escape a possible lockdown.

Namibia is probably one of the best and safest areas worldwide considering Covid. Namibia has 8 people per square mile – so there is plenty of space and fresh air. Namibia and its tourism sector is following some strict hygiene concepts. Namibia has some 1500 active cases and an averages of about 30 new daily cases, of which most are in correctional facilities.

On airports and during your flight, health and safety regulations are perfect.

- Eurowings is flying direct from Frankfurt three times per week to Windhoek non-stop.
- Ethiopian Airways is also flying three times a week with a stop in Addis Abeba.
- All flights over Johannesburg are possible, with Airlink and SAA having daily flights to Windhoek
- Easy entry into Namibia – no quarantine – you just need a negative Covid test which is not older than 72 hours
- All hotels, restaurants, lodges and shops are open with a specialized hygiene concept
- No covid test necessary while you are in Namibia
- No testing necessary on the way back home, as Namibia is considered a non-risk country
- Namibia has some very good private hospitals and doctors.
- Namibias huge open spaces, its Wildlife and friendly people are waiting for you.
